



Illinois Transitional Math Summit - on-Demand

The Postsecondary and Workforce Readiness Act (PWR Act) requires that every public high school implement a transitional math course for their seniors in the 20-21 or 21-22 school year. That process includes creating a course that meets state requirements, getting it approved, getting the right students in the course, having materials, and having teachers comfortable with the instructional approach. To make this manageable, Kathleen Almy held summits with every Illinois community college partnership throughout 2017-2019. These well attended and well received events helped hundreds of high school administrators, counselors, and math teachers get comfortable with the requirements and the process to complete them. She has continued to provide many professional development events, programs, and materials to support schools as they implement transitional math. Now she is offering summits in an on-demand video series built to help schools on their timeline with asynchronous and synchronous support while they learn.
